Unconscious thoughts and attitudes that manifest in aversions or preferences for particular groups or types of people. We are more likely to have aversions to people who are different to us.



Mental health and addiction

(In year to Sept 2018)

46% of consumers secluded were Māori





Māori are more likely to be secluded

Of people admitted to mental health units, Māori were **two times** more likely to be secluded than non-Māori (**13%** compared with **6%**).¹

Māori males aged 20–44 years have the highest seclusion rate at **18%**. Non-Māori males in this age group had a seclusion rate of **12%**.
